Dear Mr. Hall:

I have received your letter of March 3, 2000. My requests have been simple: please provide the Grassy Narrows First Nation with copies of the 1999/2000 AWS and 2000/2001 AWS for the Whiskey Jack Forest. Without having seen the plans to cut the forests within the Treaty 3 territory, there can be no meaningful discussion about these plans. You continue to refuse to provide these documents and therefore refuse to consider the concerns of the Grassy Narrows First Nation. Our request for copies of the AWS's is perfectly reasonable. Your refusal to provide them is not.

Once again, I ask that your government stop violating the treaty rights of the Grassy Narrows First Nation. And once again, I ask that you provide us with copies of the 1999/2000 AWS and the 2000/2001 AWS.
